- Are you trying to prove your worth through your work or sense of personal achievement?
- According to Jesus, what is the true purpose of the Sabbath command (see Mark 2:27; Luke 6:9-10)?
- Do you regularly experience the deep peace and rest Jesus offers here (see Matthew 11:28–30)?
- · Are you practicing the Sabbath presently?
