A New Lifestyle

We are in the fifth message in our 1 Peter series, the overall theme of how the Gospel of Jesus changes your life. It starts with a new identity (new birth) that places you in a new community (the church, a spiritual house). However, it doesn't stop there. These realities are designed to prepare you for a new relationship with the world. 1 Peter 2:11–25 focuses on how we are called to live out our faith in the world. The apostle Peter is attempting here to restructure our worldview.

Read 1 Peter 2:11-25.

- How does your faith show up in your everyday life?
- In what sense are all Christians foreigners or exiles as stated here (1 Peter 2:11) (see John 17:15–16; 1 Corinthians 7:29–31)
- How do you imagine the non-believers around you perceive you (1 Peter 12:2)? (see James 3:13)
- How is the concept of freedom stated here different from how personal freedom is generally defined by our culture (1 Peter 2:16)? (see 1 Corinthians 9:19)
- What is the motivation for bearing unjust suffering in our lives as followers of Jesus (1 Peter 2:19)? (see Philippians 4:13)
- What is the underlying principle or reason for the broad submission encouraged in this passage (1 Peter 2:15)? (see Colossians 4:5-6; 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12)
- In what specific ways can we follow Jesus in responding to suffering in our lives today? (1 Peter 2:21-23)
